Making Ground is a community engagement project for Riverside Art Museum's Riverside Art Make and is in collaboration with Gloria's Nursery and California State University Long Beach.

Orange groves root on site in Riverside, and so too do hundreds of species of plants historically brought here from all over the world. From memory and culture, narratives and histories of place are cultivated through the practice and metaphor of planting. Through interaction and exchange, Making Ground is a series of planting workshops where the community can share their living histories and practices that create roots, "make ground," and generate new histories -- challenging traditional notions of space, place, ownership, and access.
